Interview: Dr. Nathan Nachlas

Jose C. Mercado, PA-C, MMS, President-Elect

In this special interview, *The Vanguard* highlights both a physician and an organization that aim to increase awareness of our specialty and serve as a resource for the training of physician assistants in otorhinolaryngology.

In 1997, the Network of Florida Otolaryngologists (NFO) was formed by a local group of practicing otolaryngologists dedicated to sharing their knowledge and experience with their colleagues in an effort to create and to preserve the highest standards of excellence in the specialty. What began as a concept of a small group of physicians has blossomed into the largest statewide organization of its kind, boasting over 250 members.

The essence of the NFO is to provide its members resources and services that can only be obtained by large organizations. Their size enables them to deliver state of the art business support for their entire membership.

The NFO provides many services to its members, including Risk Purchasing Group Medical Malpractice Insurance, the NFO Research Team, the NFO Group Purchasing Programs, Business of Medicine Webinar Series, and the collection of high quality downloadable forms to its members. They believe passionately in supporting the practicing otolaryngologist/ head and neck surgeon, and strive to offer solutions for their members to make their practice exceptional.

The Florida Combined Otolaryngology Meeting (FCOM) is sponsored by The Florida Society of Otolaryngology—Head & Neck Surgery, The Florida Society of Facial Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery, and The Network of Florida Otolaryngologists. It is held at various sites annually across Florida and features educational tracts for physicians, advanced practice providers, residents, administrators, audiologists and students.

The one person instrumental in the foundation of the NFO and the FCOM is Dr. Nathan Nachlas. He is a facial plastic and reconstructive surgeon specializing in the nose, sinuses, and face in Boca Raton. Dr. Nachlas

pioneered the Total Nose Approach™, which combines ENT and facial plastic surgery that treats both the aesthetic and functional issues of the nose and sinuses. Dr. Nachlas was also the first surgeon in the United States to perform in-office computer guided Balloon Sinuplasty. His experience with balloon sinuplasty is one of the most extensive in the country, and he has performed over ten thousand nasal and sinus procedures such as rhinoplasty, and revision rhinoplasty.

He received his medical degree at the University of Chicago, and trained at Yale-New Haven Hospital (Surgery), The Johns Hopkins Hospital (Otolaryngology), and Beverly Hills, California (Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery).

During the recent annual meeting held at the Ritz-Carlton in Naples November 9-11, 2018, I had the opportunity to sit down with Dr. Nachlas. The meeting was well attended by more than 200 people including nearly 100 physician assistants, nurse practitioners and PA students.

Mercado:

When and why did you add lectures and learning tracts for advanced practice providers in your Florida Combined Otolaryngology Meeting?

Nachlas:

We first added the lectures for PA's about 5 years ago. Three years after completing my fellowship, I began to appreciate the looming workforce shortage in our specialty and saw PAs as a natural (continued next page)

fit. I had a very positive experience hiring a PA and incorporating her into my practice.

Mercado:

What do you say to physicians that are thinking about adding an advanced practice provider to their practice?

Nachlas:

It's the smartest thing they'll ever do! I think having a PA can shorten wait times and improve access [to care]... It's also gratifying to me to know that my patients' satisfaction is high with the care my PAs provide.

Mercado:

What do you see in the future for the NFO, the FCOM and APP in Florida?

Nachlas:

We have already seen an increased attendance by students as well as practicing PAs so we will be adding new content for next year...we are looking into creating a type of post-graduate internship for physician assistants in otolaryngology. This will

incorporate general otolaryngology, subspecialties such as rhinology and otology, ancillary services and departments such as audiology, vestibular evaluation, allergy, and sleep medicine, and an intense introduction to familiarize the newly certified PA with practice specific electronic charting.

In addition to core ENT lectures for APP, there were also lectures for students transitioning after graduation as well as contract negotiations and interview pearls to help them land that dream job. Immediately after the lectures, attendees were able to have "Speed Interviews" with providers/practices looking to add an APP. This is the third year "Speed Interviews" have been offered and at least 5 previous attendees have found jobs in ENT. It's obvious the NFO is doing a great job of increasing awareness of otolaryngology as a viable career choice for PA students. It has also gone above and beyond by providing the venue for quality ENT specific education and job placement for PAs and should serve as a model for other state ENT societies and even the American Academy of Otolaryngology / Head & Neck Surgery Foundation.

Clinical Practice Guideline: Tonsillectomy in Children


published as a supplement in the February 2019 issue of *Otolaryngology—Head and Neck Surgery*

An updated clinical practice guideline from the American Academy of Otolaryngology—Head and Neck Surgery Foundation was released in February 2019. The updated guideline provides evidence-based recommendations for children 1 to 18 years of age undergoing tonsillectomy on the pre-, intra-, and post-operative care.

Key updates include:

- Recommendation for watchful waiting for recurrent throat infection if there have been <7 episodes in the past year, <5 episodes per year in the past 2 years, or <3 episodes per year in the past 3 years;
- Administer a single intraoperative dose of intravenous dexamethasone to children undergoing tonsillectomy;
- Clinicians should recommend ibuprofen, acetaminophen, or both for pain control after tonsillectomy;
- Perioperative antibiotics to children undergoing tonsillectomy are not necessary; and
- Do not administer or prescribe codeine, or any medication containing codeine, after tonsillectomy in children younger than 12 years.

The clinical guideline for tonsillectomy in children was created by a multi-disciplinary panel including nursing, anesthesiology, consumers, family medicine, infectious



disease, otolaryngology-head and neck surgery, pediatrics, and sleep medicine.


2019 ENT for PA-C Conference
